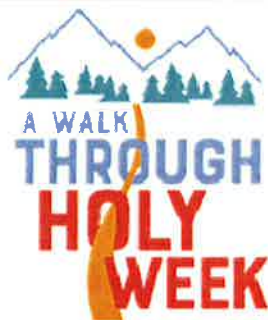

## A New Thing

Nearly one year ago, April 2017, First Christian Church participated in the Holy Cow Consulting Survey. Your participation was ranked at 76% responding to the survey with our consultant saying this was a great response. You have spoken and are providing direction and insight to our collective ministries in proclaiming the love and ministry of Jesus Christ.

We have learned a lot about our church family. Many of you attended the group gatherings to reveal the results of the survey. Several approaches have been implemented to ministry and we have discussed the data over the past months – some changes have been noticeable already and others not so noticeable.

The three top priorities which the survey has revealed (in other words, the top three choices the congregation has stated) is where you would like to see energy placed to expand or improve our ministries. They are:

1. Make necessary changes to attract families with children and youth to our church
2. Develop and implement a comprehensive strategy to reach new people and incorporate them into the life of the church, and
3. Create more opportunities for people to form meaningful relationships.

The Elders of First Christian Church have reviewed the Holy Cow document over the past months. The Leadership of FCC recently had a visioning gathering to begin to give structure to shaping ministry - being faithful to the top three priorities. At the General Board meeting this past Monday, February 26, the Elders put forth a proposal which will begin a larger implementation for living into the priorities the congregation stated in the survey.

The proposal: Beginning April 8, 2018, we will go to one worship service on Sundays. The schedule will be: Sunday School at 9:00 am, Fellowship at 10:00 am, Worship at 10:30 am.

The General Board has approved this proposal. More information will be shared in the coming weeks. The Elders or clergy are available to answer questions or share survey material.

Change is never easy, but just like Easter it reveals excitement and new beginnings. God is about to do a new thing at First Christian Church. I believe Easter people are excited about and pray about achieving and implementing new ways to proclaim the faith.

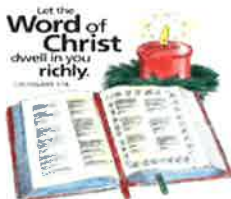

## Sara's Sisters

Well, we are still meeting. We know many of you have been ill (flu), out of town, or not coming due to our bad weather. We have missed you and hope you will be back soon.

Vicky opened our meeting with our special prayer. Our Care and Concern is for Bunky Grimes, Bobbie Roberts, Barbara, Gerry and Ramona Dickinson.

Our treasury report was given by Vicky who reported a balance of \$338.97.

Jeannie was the hostess and Jolene brought the study.

The Disciple Women's Spiritual Retreat will be April 20 – 22 in Athens, Texas.

Ann Grimes said it will be a big help if we could be collecting items (a lot on sale now) for the future Christmas boxes (school supplies, toys, small to medium clothing, tooth brushes, etc.).

Jolene brought the lesson on Priscilla and Aquila who were missionaries of the early church. Priscilla risked her life for Paul. She was a woman whose spirit and understanding of the faith helped build up the early church. When there were a lot of riots in Ephesus, they were probably the two who intervened on Paul's behalf.

Priscilla's faith had been planted years earlier in an atmosphere of strife and controversy, first in Rome and later in Corinth. The latter was a commercial center famous for its appetite for vice, hardly a place to nurture the faith of a new believer, yet that was where God transplanted her along with her husband, Aquila after Claudius expelled the Jews from Rome in 49 AD, tired of their constant fighting about Chrestus (a probable reference to Christ).

Various gods were worshipped in Corinth, especially Aphrodite, the Greek goddess of love.

After the couple had been in Corinth for about a year, they met up with a man who would involve them in yet more controversy. Paul of Tarsus was a Jew who had ruthlessly persecuted Jesus' followers until his own dramatic conversion. Lately, he had been traveling in Asia Minor and Macedonia preaching the gospel wherever he went. When he

arrived in Corinth, he probably met the couple through their common trade as tent makers. Priscilla and Aquila invited Paul to stay in their home and work with them.

After Corinth, Paul left and took Priscilla and Aquila with him. Later, Paul left for other parts and left Priscilla and Aquila to tend to the churches they started. Priscilla and Aquila worked with Apollos to instruct him in the faith. Apollos went on to Corinth where he advanced the work Paul had begun. Priscilla's role in instructing Apollos and leading the early church is remarkable. Priscilla and Aquila were Paul's best friends, helping him establish the church and risking her life for his sake. Priscilla helped establish the early church in an atmosphere of great hostility, risking her own life for the sake of the gospel she loved. What role do you think God wants **you** to play in advancing the gospel?

We will be meeting in Cornerstone Hall on March 12 at 11:00 am. Jeannie will bring our lesson and Vicky will be hostess.
